



Horizon Neuropsychological Services, LLC (HNS) is offering two 2-year pediatric postdoctoral fellowship positions within our thriving private practice for the 2025-2027 cycle. Our practice is housed across two locations (Littleton & Boulder, CO). We currently employ 6 full-time, board-eligible neuropsychologists, 3 postdoctoral fellows, 1 advanced practicum student, and 1 faculty affiliate. Our postdoctoral program offers advanced training in clinical pediatric neuropsychology and adheres to the Houston Conference guidelines for this area of specialty training. Fellows will see both pediatric and young adult patients with a broad range of neurological, neurodevelopmental, and psychological disorders. We offer services both in-person and via tele-health modalities. Fellows will participate in both individual and group supervision with multiple supervisors. Fellows will also informally present cases in weekly case conferences, will participate in monthly journal club, and will complete one scholarly activity (i.e., formal case presentation, case study write-up for publication, or literature review). Additionally, HNS offers a weekly didactic series with speakers from across the country that present on various topics across the lifespan. Fellows will complete up to 2000 hours of training each year of the program, resulting in a certificate of completion.

Minimum Qualifications:

- A doctoral degree (Ph.D./Psy.D.) in clinical psychology from an APA- or CPA- accredited program.
- An APA- or CPA-accredited internship with at least some focus on neuropsychology

Preferred Qualifications:

- Foundational neuroscience coursework.
- Strong clinical, communication, and writing skills.
- Experience administering, scoring, and interpreting neuropsychological assessments.
- Experience in working with children in any capacity (or a desire to learn).

- Experience working with autism spectrum disorder (or a desire to learn).
- Curious, motivated, professional, collaborative, collegial, and professional

Compensation & Benefits

- A competitive salary: \$70k base salary for the first year; \$75k for the second year, pending successful completion of first year and performance reviews
- Up to 8 weeks of vacation per year, depending on timing, performance reviews, and quota requirements
